The Normans

The **Normans** were a group of people who came from the Norwegian Vikings. They came to **settle in the north of France**. As a result, the Normans were made up of Vikings and native people to the region. Once they had settled, the area in northern France became known as Normandy.

The Norman Conquest

The Normans were **skilled warriors** and after taking over Normandy, they decided to take over more land. In **1066**, after the death of the Anglo-Saxon King, **Edward the Confessor**, they decided to **invade England**. This was called the **Norman Conquest**.

Battle of Hastings - 1066

The most important battle of the Norman Conquest. **King Harold II** became King of the Anglo-Saxons after Edward the Confessor's death. During the battle, Harold II was killed by the Normans. **William the Conqueror**, who was the Duke of Normandy, became the first Norman King of England.

Bayeux Tapestry

Most of the information that we have of the Norman Conquest comes from the **Bayeux Tapestry**. This is a 70-metre long piece of fabric which is embroidered with key events of the time. It was created in the 11th century and begins with the death of Edward the Confessor and ends with the Battle of Hastings.


Invalidate	To send an army to take over land.


