DEAR PARENTS/CARERS

We have been through an unprecedented and extremely challenging period since lockdown was enforced on 20th March. Throughout the period we have remained open for the children of key workers and those deemed vulnerable. Since 1st June we have further re-opened to children in Years R,1 and 6, this has been very labour intensive with two adults to each 'bubble' with a maximum of 15 children in each meaning we were unable to further re-open to additional year groups.

I would like to extend my appreciation to all of you who have worked so hard to support your child's learning through our home learning packages, you have done a remarkable job in teaching and balancing your work commitments.

Having received the guidance in relation to full reopening in September we are in the process of planning for the implementation of these recommendations. The key information for classes in September will be communicated w/c 13th July when you are notified of your child's new teacher.

Class organisation

Prior to our expansion process half the school had to be vertically grouped to accommodate year group numbers. We have now reached 3 form entry through to year 4. The only vertical grouping is in year 5/6 where a minority of year 5 pupils move into the year 6 classes on the basis of social maturation. This means that on the whole classes can move up through the school as a consistent group.

Catering Contract

We have recently gone out to tender for our cantering contract with a local company Nourish being the successful bidder. The process was carried out by the school buying club' with Nourish scoring highly in all categories and receiving excellent references from their current schools.

We look forward to a strong partnership over the coming years with the children benefitting from a quality nutritious meal. From September the cost of a Key Stage 2 paid meal will be £2.50 a day for main course, pudding, salad bar and bread.

CIF Bid

Last year we benefitted from a £350,000 roof replacement project through the Conditions Improvement Fund, a central resource accessed through a bidding system. This year we have made another further successful bid for £142,000 to have the Key stage 1 toilets refurbished. This work should start in the next few weeks and be complete ready for the start of next term. Again this will be a major benefit to the children at Wentworth.

Daily Mile Track

Our daily mile track was completed back in June and has received rave reviews from the children who have used it, several undertaking many laps before the start of school. Once again this enhances our sports provision and encourages the children to develop active and healthy habits.

Soft Start Since March we

Since March we have operated a soft start at the beginning of the school day in order to stagger children's entry into school. This has proved extremely positive creating a calm environment at a normally busy time as well as alleviating some of the traffic problems in the local area.

This is a process we will be continuing with in the new academic year. The start time for your son/daughter will be communicated to you with the email confirming your child's new class for September.
